#### Good Morning, Comrades!

Previously in our MEMBERSHIP FOCUS email discussed tactics and strategies for a renewal campaign at the Post level. After a few weeks off for the holidays, we're back with a question that was asked of us recently concerning how the Life Member Installment Plan works when it comes to your Post's membership totals.

When you look at Memstats, you will see a total of how many members have paid dues to your Post since July 1st, in the categories of LIFE, NEW, REINSTATED, and CONTINUOUS. Yet members on the Life Member Installment Plan are handled somewhat differently and to understand this we need to look into how we actually track those numbers for Memstats.

LIFE MEMBERS - the Post receives a payout for their Life members in September, which is when you will see that number tick up from zero to however many Life members you have in the Post. For new Life members who sign up after that payout date, there are subsequent payouts in January and June, and those new Life members get credited to your Memstats totals when those payouts are made. Other than those three payout dates, your Life member totals shouldn't change through the membership year on Memstats.

NEW MEMBERS - This is reasonably self-explanatory. New members who haven't been in our system as VFW members before pay their dues, you get credit for them in Memstats.

REINSTATED MEMBERS - If you have a member who has been inactive (their expiration date has passed) for more than two calendar years, and they pay dues to your Post, they are a Reinstated member and are credited in this category.

\*\*EXCEPTIONS TO THE ABOVE\*\* If anyone in those two previous categories, New or Reinstated, pays Life member dues, then they will be counted in the LIFE MEMBER category in September, January, or June as appropriate. If you would like to know how many of your Life members were New or Reinstated, then you can look at the N/R LM box.

CONTINUOUS MEMBERS - also known as Annual Members. These are your regular everyday pay-dues-yearly folks, and you get credit for them in Memstats as their dues are processed. This number ALSO includes dues-paying transfers, but not transfers whose dues were paid to their previous Post. Previous Post gets credit for them this year, that's always been the case.

LIFE MEMBER INSTALLMENT PLAN - this is not technically a separate category of membership, so it may be somewhat confusing. If a new member joins by paying the \$45 for the installment plan, they will show under your NEW MEMBER totals. If they are a reinstated member, they will be under REINSTATED, and if they were previously a paid Annual member, they will be counted under CONTINUOUS.

If a member on the Installment Plan makes their final payment during the membership year and they have already been credited to your Post as a New, Reinstated, or Continuous member, they remain in that category for Memstats accounting purposes (you do not lose an Annual member and gain a Life member, in other words) for the remainder of the membership year. In the next year, they will show up as a Life member when the Life Member payouts are made in September.

Remember that Memstats is only a count of who has paid membership dues to your Post from July 1 through June 30th. This is not the same as the Post Query, which shows you everyone in your Post broken down by status, including your Installment Life members.

In short, Installment Life members are considered to be Annual members and are counted as such in Memstats. Once their final payment is made, they become a Life member and will be counted as such when the next year's Life Member payout is made.

On this page you can also find the current VFW Membership Program which we encourage every Post to become familiar with, as it explains the criteria for various awards and recognition programs such as All-American.

#### FIRST DESERT STORM VETERAN ELECTED VFW NATIONAL COMMANDER

July 27, 2016

CHARLOTTE, N.C.

 The Veterans of Foreign Wars of the United States concluded its 117<sup>th</sup> National Convention here today by electing Brian Duffy of Louisville, Ky., as its new leader.

His election also introduces a new era for America's oldest and largest war veterans' organization, in that he becomes the first Operation Desert Storm veteran to become the VFW commander-in-chief.

Duffy served in the U.S. Air Force as a jet engine mechanic on F-4 Phantom fighter aircraft, and later as a flight engineer aboard C-141 Starlifter transport aircraft. During his service, he deployed in support of several



campaigns to include Grenada, Panama, and Operations Desert Shield and Storm in Southwest Asia. Following his military service he would be hired by United Parcel Service as a flight engineer instructor. He would rise through the UPS ranks until he retired in 2014 as assistant chief pilot, having flown worldwide as an instructor/check captain on the Boeing 757 and 767 aircraft.

**During his acceptance speech**, the new national commander strongly praised the work of the 117-year-old organization and encouraged its members to better educate others on

exactly what the VFW does for veterans, service members and their families. He did note, however, that the VFW's modest approach to reaching younger veterans wasn't resonating with a newer generation that clearly identifies with belonging to something big, doing something cool, and touting their accomplishments more.

"This great big organization we call the VFW does something very cool that most Americans—and especially those who serve in uniform—just don't know because we don't shout from the rooftops enough," he said. "Cool things like providing \$5.6 million in grants to help nearly 3,900 military and veteran families through emergency financial situations; helping more than 80,000 veterans and transitioning military to receive \$1.5 billion in earned compensation and pension from the VA; and providing millions in scholarships to veterans, service members, and high school and middle school students," he said.

Duffy has been a member of the VFW for 33 years. He first joined VFW Post 6590 in Cookstown, N.J., after returning from Grenada in 1983. He later transferred his membership to VFW Post 120 in Garden City Park, N.Y., then to VFW Post 1170 in Middletown, Ky. He served as commander of the VFW Department of Kentucky in 2006, and achieved All-American status at the VFW Post, District and Department levels.

With leadership experience at all levels of the organization, Duffy's tone throughout his remarks was one of experience and optimism for the future.

"We must push a message that the VFW is an organization that has always been rooted in service to others, that we are an organization of doers, and an organization comprised of men and women who returned home from their wars and conflicts as better, more compassionate and confident human beings," he said. "We need your Departments and Posts to turn up the volume and communicate every story—and loudly!"

Among his primary objectives for the ensuing year is heightening the focus of mental health awareness and changing the veteran's narrative—the veteran's brand—which right now has 40 percent of Americans believing half of all veterans are experiencing mental health challenges, and an astounding 92 percent of employers believing veterans need access to mental health care programs.

He said it's no secret that 20 veterans commit suicide every day, but what most folks don't know is only five of those veterans are enrolled in the VA.

"Professional mental health counselling isn't the VFW's forte insomuch as having walked the talk is," he said, calling that powerful relevance to those who deploy and for their families who anxiously await their safe return. He also said it doesn't matter if your war was in Europe, Africa, Asia or the Middle East—or in this century or the last—but that "we were all younger once, and we all came back different in one respect or another, to include thinking no one understood us," he said, which is "why the VFW cannot allow any service member to ever think no one understands them."

#### National Chaplain of the Year Award

At the National Council of Administration workshop held on Sunday, August 27, 2016 provisional approval was given to move forward in presenting a National Chaplain of the Year Award.

The following criteria will constitute the basis for nominations, and also a proposed procedure and timeline to receive nominations for this award.

#### Chaplain of the Year Criteria

- 1. Performance of Duties:
  - A. Exemplary character and conduct: e.g., A person of upmost integrity, professional execution of duties, dependability, punctuality, and timely submission of reports, etc.
  - B. Exemplary performance above and beyond the normal expectations of the position and duties.
- 2. Personal attitude which is positive and professional in all contacts with others and which represents the VFW and the Department in the best possible way.
- Commitment to the ministry and duties of the Chaplain, as reflected by service to comrades and their families and responsiveness to needs.
- 4. A member of the VFW in good standing with the Post, District, and Department.

#### **Review Committee Composition and Instructions**

- 1. A committee assembled by the National Chaplain will review nominations for the award and recommend a recipient.
- 2. The committee shall include:
  - A. The National Chaplain
  - B. Three Past National Chaplains
  - C. The most recent past recipient of the Chaplain of the Year Award.
- 3. Instructions to the Committee
  - A. The committee shall follow procedures and criteria as outlined in this document. However, if no candidates are nominated or judged by the committee to meet the criteria for Chaplain of the Year, the committee shall not recommend a recipient.
  - B. All proceedings of the committee must be kept strictly confidential.
  - C. The National Chaplain will review with the National Commander and the National Adjutant General the recommendation for Chaplain of the Year prior to announcing the award recipient.

#### Procedure

The following procedure is recommended for receiving and reviewing nominations:

- Information concerning this award will be distributed to the National Council of Administration each year following the National Council of Administration August meeting. The members of the National COA can then present this information to their respective Department Commanders and Adjutants when they give their report.
- 2. The National Chaplain will email information concerning the Chaplain of the Year Award, and begin to solicit nominations from Department Commanders and Adjutants, beginning in October.
- All nominations should be submitted to the National Chaplain by April 1. Nomination letters should be emailed, faxed, or sent USPS to the National Chaplain. Contact information is listed below.
- 4. A nomination shall address the above criteria and shall not exceed two type written pages.
- The committee shall review each nomination according to the selected criteria and recommend a recipient by April 30<sup>th</sup>.
- 6. The National Chaplain will review the Committee's recommendation for Chaplain of the Year with the National Adjutant General.
- 7. The Chaplain of the Year Award will be presented at the recipients Department Convention.
- The National Chaplain will notify the respective Department, and if feasible, request attendance to present the award.
- The recipient's Department will notify the recipient of the National Chaplain of the Year Award and request attendance at the Department Convention to receive the award.

The national commission has individual state commissioners who would like to get involved with VFW Posts who were named after WWI vets, such as VFW Post 3035 in Delphos, Ohio, which is named after two World War I soldiers, one of whom, Army Pfc. Claude L. Walterick, is buried at the American Battle Monuments Cemetery at Flanders Field, Belgium. He was KIA on Oct. 31, 1918, just 11 days short of the Armistice. VFW Senior Vice Commander-in-Chief Keith Harman is a life member of Post 3035.

# INDIAN LAND POST 12136 - DISTRICT No. 5

#### Life Saving Event:

We had 4 Post members distributing Buddy Poppies at a local business November 12th. Between 2:30pm – 2:45pm a customer was parking her car and did not put it in park. As she exited her vehicle, the car ran over her and trapped her leg under the front tire. Our members immediately called 911 and requested an ambulance. Due to the weight of the vehicle, it ruptured her leg causing an 18" gash, and bleeding profusely. The members, working as a team first removed the car from the victim's trapped leg and began administering first aid. Applying a tourniquet to the upper leg to minimize blood loss. Team members also began to comfort the victim to stay calm and assure her a medical team was on the way. Once the Ambulance arrived (also the State Police, County Sheriff officers and local Fire truck) the injured victim was placed in the Ambulance for transport. As soon as the ambulance left, the EMT personnel decided to request a helicopter airlift from the nearest shopping center (3 miles north of the accident). The woman's husband and pet dog were also in the vehicle. There is no doubt the military training these members had received, played a major role in saving her life. Our Post could not be more proud of these members in responding in such a quick and decisive manner. Their training kick in and what could have been a tragic event became lifesaving. Post members were Hillary Collins, Hershel Fogleman, Pete Sturdivant & Hank Povinelli

We gave them a \$25.00 gift card to avoid fighting and confusion. Everyone at least, lost food. Alston-Wilkes has the SSVF grant so she was there to help assist with finding new housing. That lady (Sharonda Eagle; far right) is a disabled veteran and member of the Marion VFW post. The lady in the center (Sheila Glenn) is with SC Works. She was there to assist anyone who had lost wages to the storm and to assist them in filing for unemployment. Sheila is also a veteran. I will work to try and get her to join the VFW. This was truly a wonderful day of veterans helping veterans.

### A VETERAN'S FINAL JOURNEY

It's late October, 2016 and Bunny (my wife) & I were in Pennsylvania visiting relatives when Bunny received a call from a friend, of 35 years, in Norfolk, Virginia asking if she would be interested in doing an RV (motorhome) trip to help her take her terminally ill father to visit his wife, family and friends in Los Angeles area of California one last time. Her obvious answer was YES! When I found out Randy (Karen's husband) could not make the trip because of work commitments, I said, count me in!

Background A couple of years ago Karen (the daughter who lives on the East Coast) brought her mom and dad from California to live with her because of their age and decreasing ability to support themselves. For a while they lived in their own home, but as the months rolled by, Jim (Karen's dad) became more and more ill and Karen & Randy moved her parents into their home. Taking care of the parents, her work schedule and the demands of the house wore Karen down, so she asked her sister in California if she could take their mom (Beverly) for a little while. The sister agreed and flew to VA to take mom back to CA with her to be cared for by her and her two brothers. Beverly made a couple of trips back-and-forth between VA & CA over the next few months to be with her husband of 60+ years. Along with knowing Karen & Randy for over 35 years, we have known and been friends with Karen's parents for 17+ years.

Meanwhile; over the course of the last few month, Jim became more and more ill and spent some time in the Veterans Administration Hospital and eventually a few months in the VA Hospital Hospice Care facility. The VA eventually had to release Jim to Hospice Home Care, quite frankly because he wouldn't die! For the last few months Karen & Randy have been taking care of Jim at home (with the help of some VA Hospice nurses and care-giver personnel). Jim requires 24/7 care and attention because of his condition.

**NOTE:** Jim is a Korean War Veteran who recently received a Purple Heart for wounds received during the early stages of that war (that's another story in itself). He is a 3 ½ year veteran of the US Army and served as an Infantryman, along with other duties and responsibilities while in Korea.

Meanwhile; back in CA; Beverly recently took two falls and fractured a disk in her back. This made her completely immobile. She is also suffering from dementia. These two things caused her to be unable to travel to VA for many months to come, if at all. Jim is unable to fly because of his condition and constant need of oxygen. Thus, they are both stuck a continent apart and this disturbed them both greatly. Jim would get off the phone after a call to Beverly and cry because they could not be together. This caused Karen to hatch the RV trip plan. Rent an RV, load it up with Jim's needed oxygen equipment and medicines and food for four and head west. Karen knew that this would be the last chance for Jim and Beverly to be together and for Jim to see his other daughter, two sons and all the relatives that live in Western California. 72nd anniversary of D-Day, Reuters photographer Chris Helgren compiled A number of photos from that fateful day and took his own photographs from the exact same locations.

The VA has launched 1-844-MyVA311 (1-844-698-2311) as a 24/7 one-stop information service platform for all VA services. Veterans, families, and caregivers who call this number can be connected to disability, pension, health care eligibility, enrollment, and burial benefits, the veterans' crisis line, the homeless veteran's helpline and/or to a self-service locator to find the nearest VA facility. This is an effort to ensure veterans no longer need to know what number to call for specific programs and services, instead, veterans can call this one number and be connected to the correct call center.

VA Cemeteries Offering Pre-Enrollment for Eligible Veterans: The Department of Veterans Affairs (VA) this week announced it now provides eligibility determinations for interment in a VA national cemetery prior to the time of need. Through the Pre-Need Determination of Eligibility Program, upon request, individuals can learn if they are eligible for burial or memorialization in a VA national cemetery. Secretary of Veterans Affairs Robert A. McDonald said, "This new program reaffirms our commitment to providing a lifetime of benefits and services for veterans and their families." Now veterans and their families can plan for their burial needs which will alleviate some of the burden later.

Interested individuals may submit <u>VA Form 40-10007</u>, *Application for Pre-Need Determination of Eligibility for Burial in a VA National Cemetery*, and supporting documentation, such as a DD Form 214, if readily available, to the VA National Cemetery Scheduling Office by toll-free fax at <u>1-855-840-8299</u>; email to <u>Eligibility.PreNeed@va.gov</u>; or mail to the National Cemetery Scheduling Office, P.O. Box 510543, St. Louis, MO 63151.
